Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine

Authorized for people ages 18 years and older.

Type: Protein subunit

Number of doses: 2 doses in the primary series, given 3-8 weeks apart.

People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised should also receive 2 doses,

given 3 weeks apart (a 3rd primary dose is not currently authorized).

Booster shot: Novayax COVID-19 vaccine is not authorized for use as a booster dose

Frequently asked questions:

Can I receive the Novavax before or after receiving a Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson vaccine?

No, you can not receive the Novavax vaccine before or after receiving Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Will the Novavax vaccine give me COVID-19?

No. The Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted does not contain SARS-CoV-2 and cannot give you COVID-19.

What are the common side effects of Novavax?

Much like the other COVID-19 vaccines, common side effects after receiving the Novavax COVID-19 vaccine include soreness at the injection site, fatigue, muscle pain and headaches

Can I receive the Novavax vaccine at the same time as other vaccines?

Data have not yet been submitted to FDA on the administration of the Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted at the same time as other vaccines. If you are considering receiving the Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted with other vaccines, discuss your options with your healthcare provider.

Can I receive Novavax if I am pregnant or breastfeeding?

Discuss your options with your healthcare provider if you are pregnant or breastfeeding. A pregnancy exposure registry monitors pregnancy outcomes in women who received Novavax during pregnancy. Women vaccinated with Novavax during pregnancy are encouraged to enroll in the registry by visiting https://c-viper.pregistry.com/.
